

My India is a voluntary organization formed by the students of BITS, Pilani on **Feb 12th, 2005** with the mission of building a great nation by eradicating the problems that pose a great threat to the upliftment of the country. Since its inception, **My India** has been focusing on education and rural development which were identified as the primary facets of a developed nation. From a small group of ten people, **My India** has grown large enough to spread the movement to many other places, established chapters at four other places of the country and could provide a platform for dedicated countrymen across these places to work towards a developed nation.

On the **12th of July 2006**, representatives of **My India** from BITS PILANI had come to your college- Joginpally Bhaskar Rao Institute of Engineering and Technology, to give a presentation about **My India**. The presentation was a huge success. It inspired us to think about Our India, and our role in the shaping up of the future of our country.

Then **The JBIET-Hyderabad Chapter of "My India"** was started on **August 15th 2006**, and has been running successfully ever since. We the members had distributed sweets in the Government school in Rasoolpura, Begumpet, on the 15th of August, and attended the function, which marked the beginning of the construction of the compound wall for the school. Since then, we have taken up many projects and have seen a marked difference in the people associated.

The first project that we have undertaken is that of the village of *Yenkapally*, which is situated some 2 kms from our college. And we are happy for the great support and encouragement given to us by the Sarpanch of the village. We have been conducting regular meetings since then, on Saturdays to review the work done in that week and to make plans for the following week and work out the best way to implement them.

We have dealt with a few basic issues in the school like proper drinking water and food, toilet facilities, electricity supply; Teachers for English and math; providing proper equipment and teachers and the required encouragement to pursue their interest in a particular sport or game.

And now, **My India** has added another glowing feather to its cap. It has been registered as a Non- Profit Organization and transformed in to “**NIRMAN ORGANISATION**” with Hyderabad as the Headquarters, on the *First Anniversary of our organization, 12th July, 2007*. We wish to do much more under this Non-Profit Organization and be useful in many more ways.

As the first initiative of **NIRMAAN** this semester, we have organized the orientation program for the 2nd years. There was a good turn out with nearly 75 interested students from different branches. The session went for nearly two hours with the project coordinators from 3rd year explaining the functions. It was a totally interactive gathering, with few students coming up to the stage and discussing different problems India is facing and their view on how to conquer them. The flash presentations made by the Bits-Pilani technical team were very moving and inspiring. Finally around 20 students came forward to join and take part in the **Nirmaan** activities.

ADOPTION OF NEW SCHOOL AT OLD SAFILGUDA

This year marked Triple celebrations for the members of **My India**, and our happiness knew no bounds. On the 15th of August, 2007, the Registration of **My India** as a Non-Profit Organization acted as a harbinger of much more happy news. Our Independence Day Celebrations were coupled with the adoption ceremony of yet another Government school at Old Safilguda, Hyderabad. We are very much delighted to be a part of such a school and to work for it. The strength of the school is around 400, the classes being from I to VII Standard. Their Inventory includes an area of 700 sq. yards, with 6 rooms and 9 teachers. The children do have library and sports periods thrice a week, but there is a need for a place to play.

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS:

Yenkapally:

Our second year at the Yenkapally School made us participate in the celebrations with much more enthusiasm and galore.

- 1) Donated equipment required for Science Laboratory (Chemistry)
- 2) Conducted academic events and competitions like essay writing, elocution, memory test, Quiz, Poetry Recitation, etc.

- 3) Distributed prizes to the Winners on Independence Day.
- 4) Conducted meeting with the Village Youth Committee.

Some of the proposals and requests received from the Villagers are as follows:

- 1) Concentration on English (esp. Grammar) and Math especially for X Standard
- 2) Conduct Career Guidance and Motivational Classes at least once a week.
- 3) Set up the Village Library accessible by everyone, the young and old, of the village.
- 4) Vocational Training- to give vocational training in various professions like carpentry, welding, tailoring etc. to the villagers and create a livelihood for them
- 5) Transformation of the Village School to "My India MODEL SCHOOL".

Old Safilguda:

- 1) Conducted academic events and competitions like essay writing, elocution, memory test, Quiz, Poetry Recitation, etc.
- 2) Distributed prizes to the Winners on Independence Day.
- 3) Conducted meeting with the Headmaster and Teachers, and discussed about the facilities available at the school and listed out their requirements.

Proposals and Requests from the school:

- 1) Drinking water facility required. Funds for new Bore Well have been granted but the entrance of the school is too small to allow a lorry inside.
- 2) A Syntex Tank to store drinking water.
- 3) Benches in all classrooms
- 4) Uniforms for some of the children who cannot afford them
- 5) Improvements in Electricity facility
- 6) A servant maid to take care of the sanitation, etc, of the school
- 7) Washrooms where the children can wash their hands before and after lunch.
- 8) Toilets for the children and teachers.
- 9) Proposal for building a shed on the roof of the school building to accommodate a class there.
