BRIEF HISTORY:

Master **Advaith** aged 2 year 5 months reported with his parents for psychological testing. The chief complaints reported that poor eye contact, not responding to name call, mild hyperactive and speech delay. First issue of non-consanguineous parents full term normal delivery. Average birth weight was reported. All developmental milestones were reported to be normal except speech.

TEST ADMINISTERED:

1. Gesell Children's Behaviour Schedule(GCBS)
2. Vineland's Social Maturity Scale (VSMS)
3. Child Hood check list for Autism in Toddlers (CHAT)

BEHAVIORAL OBSERVATION:

The child is partially cooperative for the psychological assessment. Social smile is present. He is partially maintained eye contact. Attention could be aroused but not sustained

He could speak only mono syllables. Speech delay was reported.

On CHAT, the child scored 2/5 critical questions indicating at mild risk for Autism.

SUMMARY:

Test findings of Master has features of Mild Developmental Delay (DQ of 60) with at mild risk for Autism and mild hyperactivity.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Consultation with Neurologist
- Early Intervention
- Speech Stimulation
- Occupational Therapy
- Sensory Integration Therapy
- Behaviour modification
- Parents were counselled
- Review after 4 months.
